**Re: Advice Letter No. 14 of Calnev Pipe Line, L.L.C.**

Dear Mr. Gatchalian:

Calnev Pipe Line, L.L.C. ("Calnev") hereby submits for filing six copies of the following proposed tariff schedules that govern the transportation of petroleum products by pipeline:

- Supplement No. 2 to Cal PUC No. 12

Calnev's Cal PUC No. 13, Rules and Regulations, Item 40 Minimum Batch and Delivery Requirements states that the minimum quantity to be accepted or delivered will be specified in the Local tariff covering the movement. Calnev's Local Tariff No. 12 neglected to include the Minimum Batch and Delivery as required by Cal PUC Tariff No. 13. Therefore the proposed supplement adds the following table:

Minimum Batch sizes at Origin and Delivery Barrels at Destination are shown in the table below.

Colton, San Bernardino County, California	All Locations	5,000 Bbls	2,500 Bbls

The base rates in the tariff listed above are unchanged. There are no revenue impacts associated with this inclusion. A short notice is being requested to conform Calnev's Local Tariff No. 12 with the minimum batch and delivery requirements of Calnev's Cal PUC No. 13 in order to ensure operational consistency between shipments tendered for delivery to all Calnev intrastate destinations under Cal PUC Tariff No. 12. The subject advice letter seeks no change in rates or level of service. SFPP is requesting this tariff supplement be effective September 5, 2008 pending disposition by the California Public Utilities Commission under Industry Rule 5, Tier 1.

We are also enclosing herewith one additional copy of this transmittal, including attachments, and respectfully request that they be stamped at the time of filing with the Commission's file stamp and returned in the enclosed envelope for our records.

Anyone may protest this advice letter to the California Public Utilities Commission. The protest must set forth the specific grounds on which it is based, including such items as financial and service impact. Protests must be made in writing and not later than twenty days after the date of this Advice Letter. The protest should be addressed to:
